

WOMEN ARE SLIGHTLY MORE LIKELY TO HAVE HAD THEIR WORST EXPERIENCE OF MISOGYNY IN <u>PUBLIC SPACES</u>.

WHEREAS MEN ARE MORE LIKELY TO HAVE HAD THEIR WORST EXPERIENCE ONLINE OR IN THE MEDIA.

MEN TEND TO RECOGNISE MISOGYNY CONCEPTUALLY, BUT ARE LESS LIKELY THAN WOMEN TO NOTICE IT IN REALITY.







Who is most responsible for misogynistic behaviour?
















